#### **Know the Conference Venue**

Taj Palace, New Delhi, opened in 1983, is a premier luxury hotel in the diplomatic enclave of Chanakyapuri. Its architecture blends Mughal and contemporary styles, reflecting India's heritage while offering modern amenities. Set amidst six acres of lush gardens, the hotel provides a serene environment in the bustling city.

Taj Palace has several rooms and suites named after prominent figures in Indian history. Some of the notable ones include:

**Jehangir:** Named after Emperor Jehangir, the fourth Mughal Emperor of India, this room reflects the elegance and sophistication associated with the Mughal era.

**Mumtaz:** Reminiscent of timeless beauty and romance this room is named after Mumtaz Mahal, the wife of Emperor Shah Jahan and the inspiration behind the construction of the Taj Mahal.















**Shahjehan:** One of the greatest Mughal emperors, Emperor Shah Jahan is known for his architectural achievements and this room is a tribute to his contributions.

**Roshanara:** This grand, five-sided medieval-themed venue with elegant tapestries celebrates the Mughal princess and talented poet, Roshanara Begum.

**Jahanara:** This room features two golden pavilions- one on either side of the Khas Mahal, grandeur befitting Jahanara Begum, a Mughal princess, who was given the imperial title 'Padshah Begum'.

**Sheesh Mahal:** This room draws inspiration from the name "Sheesh Mahal" or the Palace of Mirrors constructed by Emperor Shah Jahan.

**Durbar Ballroom:** The word "Durbar" has Persian origins and was initially associated with ceremonial assemblies during the Mughal Empire. The Durbar Hall at the Taj Palace serves as a multifunctional space for business meetings, conferences, and celebrations.
